Jeffrey S. Guy, M.D., is Associate Professor of Surgery in the Department of Surgery, Division of Trauma Surgery and Critical Care, at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, Tenn. He has specialized training in burn surgery, trauma surgery and critical care.

Guy is certified in general surgery and surgical critical care and is a certified wound specialist. In addition to teaching PHTLS, serving on its Executive Council and serving as its associate medical director, he is an instructor for Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Advanced Burn Life Support (ABLS) and Fundamentals of Critical Care Support (FCCS).

He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 1991 from Kent State University and his Masters of Science degree in Biology/Physiology from the University of Akron in 1996. He earned his M.D. from Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine, where he also did his internship and residency in general surgery. He performed his fellowship in trauma surgery research at Case Western Reserve University, School of Medicine and Cleveland MetroHealth Medical Center from 1994 to 1995, and his fellowship in surgical critical care and trauma surgery at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill from 1997 to 1998. His fellowship in burn surgery was performed at the North Carolina Jaycee Burn Center, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, from 1998 to 1999.

Guy also has served in the Charles Fox Traveling Burn Fellowship, American Burn Association, at the University of Iowa, Iowa City, The New York Hospital, New York City, University of Washington Burn Center at Harborview, Seattle, Wash., and Massachusetts General Hospital and Shriners' Burn Institute, Boston.

He began his medical career in 1997 as an instructor in the Department of Surgery at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In 1999, he started at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, where he has held the positions of assistant professor of surgery, associate professor of surgery and director, of the Vanderbilt Regional Burn Center. He also serves as a member of their Resuscitation Committee, Critical Care Committee, Laboratory Committee, Grand Rounds Committee, Operating Room Redesign Committee, Perioperative Enterprise Committee, Main Operating Room Committee, Out of Operating Room Procedures Committee, Conscious Sedation Committee and the Medical Board. He's also program director for Combat Trauma Training, 86th Combat Support Hospital, 4th MEDCOM, U.S. Army.

In addition, Guy serves as the medical director for the Paramedic Training Program at Columbia State Community College, Franklin, Tenn.; as burn surgeon for the Disaster Medical Assistance Team, B11DI Specialty Team, National Disaster Medical System, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Department of Homeland Security; as burn and trauma surgeon for the Disaster Medical Assistance Team, Tennessee General Medical Team-I, National Disaster Medical System, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Department of Homeland Security; and medical director for Tennessee State Parks. He is a consultant for the National Burn Prevention Advisory Council, Burn Foundation,

based in Philadelphia, a board member of the American Academy of Wound Management, and an ad-hoc grant reviewer for the Food and Drug Administration.

He is a member of more than 20 organizations and has received more than 10 awards for his work. He has presented hundreds of times.

Guy has published in numerous publications, including *Surgical Forum*, *Critical Care Medicine*, *Journal of Trauma*, *Journal of Burn Care* and *American Surgeon*, and has written many book chapters. He has edited the textbooks *Military Prehospital Trauma Life Support, Fifth Edition*, and *Prehospital Drug Therapy, First Edition*.
