EMS providers respond to bombings, active shooters, biological threats, and natural disasters. EMS is also critical to our ability to respond to public health crises, including outbreaks of infectious diseases in rural, suburban, and urban areas.

Despite its importance to our healthcare system, EMS remains significantly underfunded. Inadequate funding can present serious challenges to EMS practitioners in the field and harm patients in need. EMS must be fully integrated into our nation's medical preparedness and response strategy and providers must have the training and equipment necessary to achieve zero preventable deaths.

#### Facts:

- Trauma is the leading cause of death for Americans aged 45 and younger, leading to 147.790 deaths in 2014.
- An estimated 30,000 Americans die each year from traumatic injuries they could have survived with better emergency care.
- EMS is equipped to respond to our nation's emergent, urgent, and preventive healthcare needs and lower our nation's healthcare costs.

Congressional support for EMS is needed now more than ever. The EMS Caucus will bring a more disciplined focus to these issues and form a more collective and cohesive bipartisan message to support EMS practitioners nationwide. The EMS Caucus will help promote, educate, and increase awareness around the federal policy issues impacting EMS and serve as a resource for policy questions.
